



# Dry Sandford School Uniform

The school logo is on sweatshirts, cardigans, PE kit and book bags.

## Winter Uniform (Autumn and Spring Terms)

- Burgundy jumper/sweatshirt or cardigan
- Yellow polo shirt
- Grey or black trousers (not leggings), skirt or pinafore dress
- Grey socks or tights

## Summer Uniform (Summer Term)

- Burgundy sweatshirt or cardigan
- Yellow polo shirt with grey or black trousers (not leggings) or shorts (not cycling shorts)
- OR a red and white gingham dress (may wear cycling shorts underneath)
- Grey or white socks or tights

## Footwear – Please note: separate indoor shoes are not required.

- All children should come to school wearing a pair of sturdy, toe-covered **black shoes** or **plain black trainers**.
- **Trainers** should be worn for PE or when it is their allocated football day at break/lunchtime.
- A pair of **welly boots** should be kept in school for use in Forest School, in the pond area, during wet weather, and for other outdoor activities.

## PE kit

### (NB: Reception pupils will not need PE kit until the Summer Term)

- Burgundy t-shirt
- Burgundy sports shorts (not cycling shorts or leggings)
- Trainers
- In colder weather, children may wear plain black or burgundy jogging bottoms over their PE shorts and a school fleece or school jumper/sweatshirt over their PE t-shirt

Reception and Key Stage 1 pupils – bring PE kit into school in a named drawstring bag.

Key Stage 2 pupils – come into school already wearing PE kit on timetabled PE days.

## Jewellery and Hair

- One pair of **stud earrings** and a **watch** may be worn for school if desired. For health and safety reasons, we cannot allow other jewellery, smart watches or step-counting devices. All jewellery **must be removed during PE lessons**, including swimming activities.
- It is advisable that children have their ears pierced at the end of the **summer term**, as children are not allowed to take part in swimming sessions for **6 weeks** following such treatment. Newly pierced studs may be taped with medical tape, provided from home, until they can be safely removed for PE.
- We also ask that children with longer hair have it tied back with plain burgundy or black hair bands and headbands, or gingham-style in the summer.
- Please save special hair accessories, jewellery, nail polish and temporary tattoos for use at home.

## Mobile phones

For safeguarding reasons, mobile phones should not be used on school grounds. For those Year 5 and 6 pupils who walk home by themselves, mobile phones may be brought into school and handed into the office for safekeeping, if parents have provided written permission for them to do so.

## Book Bag

These are available from the school office for a cost of £7, to be paid in cash.

## Swimming (Key Stage 2 pupils only)

Swimming costume or trunks and a swimming hat. Children may also wear a lycra swimming top with sleeves. Goggles may be worn if preferred (we will ask for parental permission for children to wear goggles).

## Forest School clothing (Reception and Key Stage 1 pupils only)

Winter:

- Waterproof trousers and jacket
- Welly boots
- Warm socks (a thin pair under a thicker pair)
- Winter hat and gloves
- Comfortable clothing suitable for use outdoors
- Warm under layer (fleece, jogging bottoms, long sleeve top)

Summer:

- Waterproof trousers and jacket
- Welly boots
- Sun hat
- Long-sleeved top and long trousers (to protect skin from twigs, insects, etc.)

**All clothes brought into school, i.e. PE kit, as well as uniform, must be clearly labelled with the child's name.**
